Plenary Speaker: Dr. Timothy Stanley

Plenary Address: Racisms and the Challenges of our Times: Rethinking Antiracism for the Twenty-first Century

### Plenary

Racism is the key challenge of our times, shaping the responses to all the other challenges. The structure of racism shapes how people engage with antiracism education. By taking this structure into account, a pedagogy connection can overcome growing polarization and the resurgence of white supremacist movements. This pedagogy makes visible human beings' complex material, symbolic and embodied interconnections and help to ensure that the space for racisms to develop does not develop in the first place.

### Biography

Timothy J. Stanley is Professor Emeritus in the Faculty of Education and the Institute of Indigenous Studies and Research of the University of Ottawa. With over forty years of experience in antiracism education, he researches the links between contemporary racisms, people's lived histories and forms of historical memory.
